






## Sustainable Forest Management

- Pioneered landscape level ecosystem management
- Canada seeks a balances science-based approach between environmental, social and economic needs over time
- Key features of SFM in Canada include:
  - Legislation, regulations, policies for forest management
  - Conservation of biodiversity
  - Adaptive management
  - Monitoring and assessment
- Public consultation is a cornerstone of SFM







#### **Governments and Canada's Forests**

- Canada's provinces and territories have jurisdiction over lands and resources management
- Federal roles on forests:
  - International trade and foreign policy
  - Aboriginal affairs
  - Economic and fiscal policy
  - Management of federal lands
- Shared responsibilities:
  - Environmental protection
  - Science and technology



Co-management agreements with **Aboriginal Peoples** represent another form of forest governance in Canada









### Canada – 1<sup>st</sup> in forest certification

- Three internationally recognized standards in use in Canada:
  - Forest Stewardship Council (FSC)
  - Canadian Standards Association (CSA)
  - Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI)
- Largest amount (145.7 M ha) of third party certified forest area in the world
- 40% of global certification







### **Conclusions**

- Canada is steward of a vast public endowment.
- The reality
  - the forest is a renewable resource
  - commercial harvesting takes place on less than x% of forest land;
  - disturbances are part of the natural forest cycles
- There are many checks and balances to ensure sustainable forest management.
